The company is headquartered in Highland, Michigan and remains a leading worldwide manufacturer of industrial air valves.

The Carls Foundation has funded a lot of land preservation in our region where few other foundations have. Funded projects include the Sharon Rose Leonatti Memorial Nature Sanctuary in Kimball Township with a large population of Michigan Endangered Painted Trillium, and large parts of Anchor Bay Woods in New Baltimore adjacent to our Gerrits Sanctuary in Ira Township. Cargill Salt of Saint Clair specializes in the production of food-grade salt and other salt products from the natural salt deposits underlying the area. One of their unique salts, produced only at the Saint Clair facility, is Alberger flake salts. These are tiny, multi-faceted crystals created from a process that starts with a hollow pyramid shape. These crystals have a large surface area and low bulk density which provides superior adherence, blendability, and rapid solubility compared to regular cube-shaped granulated salt. The rapid solubility of Alberger salt gives a flavor burst when used as a topping on food. It is used in seasonings, doughs, snacks, meats, spice blends, popcorn, nuts, peanut butter, cheeses, and for curing, baking, and pickling. Lay's potato chips and Reese's Peanut Butter Cups are made with the Alberger salt produced only at the Saint Clair plant.
